Coverdell Honored by President Bush



Paul Coverdell was very sympathetic to every parent's hope for a quality education for their children. He was instrumental in establishing tax-free savings accounts for education expenses.

Last summer, President Bush honored Senator Paul Coverdell's lifetime commitment to service.

"Today we come together to honor one such man, who dedicated his life to service. A life who left us far too soon," said President Bush as he signed a bill which was recently passed that renames those savings accounts, The Coverdell Education Savings Accounts.

"He had a great heart and compassion for others, and that could be seen in his imaginative and strong leadership of the Peace Corps," said President Bush. "As the Corps' first post-Cold War director, he had a vision for a new era, and the leadership to bring those dreams into being."

The Peace Corps headquarters in Washington D.C. has also been renamed the Paul D. Coverdell Peace Corps Headquarters. This is in conjunction with the renaming of the Peace Corps World Wise School Program to the Paul D. Coverdell World Wise School Programs.

Senator Miller of Georgia also honored him, announcing the construction of The Paul D. Coverdell Building for Biomedical and Health Sciences at the University of Georgia.

President Bush departed with these comments, "I've spoken today honoring Paul. The truth is, he honored us by his selfless service. We're lucky to have known him."
